



## Washington State | Phase Reopening Outline for Faith-Based Organizations Applied to FāVS Center

### **Phase 1**

***Outdoor services*** with up to 100 individuals, so long as six feet of physical distance can be achieved between households. Cloth face coverings are required for all participants. Choirs not allowed.

### **Phase 2**

***Outdoor services*** with up to 100 individuals, so long as six feet of physical distance can be achieved between households. Cloth face coverings are required. Choirs not allowed.

***Indoor services*** with up to 30 individuals, so long as six feet of physical distance can be achieved between households. Cloth face coverings are required for all participants indoors. Choirs not allowed.

### **Phase 3**

***Outdoor services*** with up to 200 individuals, so long as six feet of physical distance can be achieved between households. Cloth face coverings are not required unless people cannot maintain six feet of physical distance between households. Choirs not allowed.

***Indoor services*** with up to 60 individuals, so long as six feet of physical distance can be achieved between households. Cloth face coverings are required for all participants indoors. Choirs not allowed.

### **Phase 4**

Allow gatherings with greater than 50 people. (FāVS Center has a maximum capacity of 263 (standing) indoors.)

Health requirements in this phase will be followed as soon as they are known.

### **Memorandum on Phase 1, 2, and 3 Religious Weddings and Funerals**

***Outdoor ceremonies*** with up to 30 people and at least six feet of physical distancing between households is required. Receptions are prohibited.

***Indoor ceremonies*** only in Phase 2 and 3 with up to 30 people and at least six feet of physical distancing between households is required. Masks are required. Receptions are prohibited.

### **Mask & Social Distance Guidance (Phase 1 - 4)**

As of July 28, 2020 the secretary of health has ordered all individuals to wear a face covering in any indoor public setting or when outdoors and unable to maintain 6 feet of physical distance from others. Face coverings can be unsafe for some people with certain health or medical issues. The order includes some exemptions for those individuals, meaning they are not obligated to wear a face covering and they are not subject to fines or citations. Children under the age of 2 should not wear a face covering. (Children ages 3-5 are encouraged to wear a covering, children 5 and older are required.)
